This week's learning comes from Year 3 and Year 4

Year 3 have been learning about length and measuring in maths this term. We have learnt how to measure using millimetres, centimetres and metres as well as which different equipment we can use. We took our learning outside and had a go at measuring objects in the playground and on the field using a metre stick. We even had a go at measuring the length of the MUGA!



<u>Year 4</u>

In Year 4, we have been learning about electricity by creating circuits, designing electrical safety posters, and examining the different power sources of everyday devices. We have explored how electricity flows in a circuit to power devices. By engaging in hands-on activities, such as constructing circuits using batteries, wires, and light bulbs, we have gained a better understanding of how electricity works. We have also been demonstrating our knowledge of electrical safety by creating informative posters to raise awareness about potential hazards and precautions to take when working with electricity. In our most recent lesson, we compared the power sources of electrical items. This helped us to reflect on electricity in our everyday lives.



Zones of regulation

You may have heard your child talking at home about different emotions through colours with phrases such as "I am in the green zone." Or perhaps your child hasn't mentioned anything at all. During Inset training on Monday 15th April, staff had training on supporting children with their emotional literacy and understanding by using "Zones of Regulation" All class teachers shared the different zones with their class and spoke about how children may feel in the different zones. The emphasis is on supporting children to talk about their emotions and to consider strategies to enable them to move between the different zones.
